Adult Beginner 18+

The intention of the **Adult Beginner Category** is to show a basic understanding of intro level and basic Dakota Language. It is to encourage beginner adult learners that may just be starting their language learning journey.

Please choose the appropriate competition level based on your own or your students' knowledge. You must have a **3-person team** to participate. **All** members of your team must **equally** participate throughout the challenge.

Round 1

Introduction Q&A

- One person on your team will give a short introduction (see Example 1 on Page 2).
- Each person will be asked a question about themselves (see Example 2 on Page 3).

Round 2

- See list of words on Page 4.
- Part 1: Use the verb wanjyakA (see Example 3 on Page 5).
- Part 2: Use the verb wastedakA (see Example 4 on Page 5).
- No one word responses!

Round 3

Odowaŋ (Song)

- At least one team member will be asked to sing a song in Dakota.
- It can be a traditional song, or an English song translated to Dakota.
- You will be judged on your use of the language, not on your singing voice.
