Please choose the appropriate competition level based on your own knowledge. You must have a **3-person team** to participate. **All** members of your team must **equally** participate throughout the challenge.

Round 1

Kahoot

- Your team will play a Kahoot on provided devices.
- A Kahoot is an interactive game-based learning platform.
- Points are based on how fast you correctly answer.

Round 2

Introduction

• One person on your team will give a traditional introduction for themselves and for their teammates.

Round 3

Conversations

- Each team will be given a certain amount of time to create a conversation with the verb that they are assigned.
- All team members must participate in the conversation.
- More points will be awarded to a more complex conversation.
- See Example 1 on page 4.

Round 4

Storytelling

- Your team will be asked to tell a story in Dakota, any kind of story.
- More points will be awarded to a more complex story.

Round 5

Odowaŋ (Song)

- At least one team member will be asked to sing a song in Dakota.
- It can be a traditional song, or an English song translated to Dakota.
- You will be judged on your use of the language, not on your singing voice.
