

LEARN MORE ABOUT MDEWAKANTON DAKOTA HISTORY AT HOCOKATA TI

Hoċokata Ti is the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community (SMSC) cultural center and gathering space and it features a 3,805-sqaure-foot public exhibit, *Mdewakanton: Dwellers of the Spirit Lake*. Providing visitors with a cultural experience, this exhibit enhances their knowledge and understanding of the Mdewakanton Dakota people and their history.

ADDITIONAL PROGRAMMING


In addition to the exhibit *Mdewakanton: Dwellers of the Spirit Lake*, learners can participate in other offerings to further their understanding of Dakota ways. Programs that are available to choose from include: Arts, Dakota Language, SMSC Collections, Presentations, and Dakota Lifeways.

Additional programming is only available as an add-on to a tour of the exhibit, *Mdewakanton: Dwellers of the Spirit Lake*. All sessions offered are contingent upon staff availability, resources, and seasonal appropriateness.



ARTS

Students will let their inner artist shine through these creative offerings selected by Cultural Resources staff. These projects showcase the techniques that Dakota artists continue to use in today's modern world. Students will first view imagery from within the SMSC Collections area to gain inspiration and then complete a piece of art that can be taken home and cherished for years.



SUNKTANKA/TATANKA Wooden Sculpture

Recommended group size: 15-60 participants

Ages: 3rd-5th grade

Duration: 1 hour

Cost: \$5 per participant

Learn about bison through a hands-on presentation, and then paint and adorn a bison wooden art sculpture. To gain some inspiration, participants will view pictures of traditional Dakota designs chosen by the SMSC Collections team.

PARFLECHE BUSINESS CARD POUCH

Recommended group size: 15-60 participants

Ages: 6th-12th grade Duration: 1 hour Cost: \$5 per participant

Parfleche containers are traditional storage boxes made from animal rawhides. Parfleche storage containers are still made and utilized today and can hold a variety of items. Cultural Resources staff will help participants make a small pouch, large enough for business cards, that can be used each day.

WINTER COUNT ACTIVITY

Recommended group size: 15-60 participants

Ages: 6th-12th grade

Duration: 1 hour

Cost: \$5 per participant

Learn about the historical importance of winter counts to Indigenous people and how art served as a medium to document historical events. Led by Cultural Resources staff, participants will create their own historical record using paint and natural materials.

WELLNESS WHEEL

Recommended group size: 15-60 participants

Ages: 6th-12th grade

Duration: 1 hour

Cost: \$5 per participant

For thousands of years, the Medicine Wheel has represented balance and holistic well-being in many Native cultures. In this activity, participants will learn about the Medicine Wheel and explore this tradition by creating their own Wellness Wheel—a personal version that reflects the interconnected elements of physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual health.

All craft offerings are appropriate for ages 10 and older. No prior experience is required—just the willingness to learn something that might not have been known before.

DAKOTA LANGUAGE

These language courses will provide students with the basic skills to speak, listen, read, and write in the Dakota language. Taking these courses will expand on the knowledge of Minnesota's original language, culture, and history. A variety of lessons are available and will be customized to meet the target age of the group.

TOUR OF COLLECTIONS

These offerings utilize the Collection of the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community to help learners understand the design and meaning behind the material culture of the Dakota people.

When visitors walk through the SMSC Collections area, they will learn about the history of the collection, review current research, and view a multitude of artifacts. The objects come from many different cultures and makers, so this tour can cover multiple areas.

The SMSC is a part of the Oceti Śakowiŋ, or the Seven Council Fires, which includes the Dakota, Lakota, and Nakota people—known to some as the Great Sioux Nation. The Seven Council Fires are:

Mdewakanton (Mdewakantunwan), the Spirit Lake People

Wahpekute (Wahpekute), the Shooters Among the Leaves People

Wahpeton (Wahpetuŋwaŋ), the People Dwelling Among the Leaves

 $\textbf{Sisseton} \; (\textbf{Sisituŋwaŋ}), \, \textbf{the People of the Fish Village(s)}$

Yankton (Ihanktunwan), the Dwellers at the End

Yanktonai (Ihanktunwanna), the Little Dwellers at the End

Teton (Títuŋwaŋ), the Dwellers on the Plains

Today, the tribal governments and communities of the Oceti Śakowiŋ are located throughout the Upper Midwest, including Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Nebraska, and Montana in the United States, and Alberta, Manitoba, and Saskatchewan in Canada.
